Dear Parents

The **Working with Children Check** (WWC) is a compulsory screening strategy in Western Australia and is mandated by the government. The Working with Children Act 2004 requires people who engage in 'child-related work' to apply for a Working with Children (WWC) Check. This includes work done by volunteers. Certain people, such as parent volunteers may be exempt from applying for a WWC Check in certain situations. **Grandparent volunteers require a Working With Children Check.** **If your child's grandparent volunteers at Aranmore Catholic Primary School eg. class roster, school sausage sizzles, carnivals etc they will require a Working With Children Check.** In regards to Bunnings Sausage Sizzles, the service is not child related and adults are serving the public therefore a WWC is not required according the WWC department.

Tomorrow **Aranmore Catholic Primary School will be a polling place** for the by-election. The **P&F** is organising a **cake stall** on the day so please let your friends and neighbours know that we are a polling place and encourage them to come down to our school to do their voting.

THE BISHOPS' RELIGIOUS LITERACY ASSESSMENT 2017

At the request of the Western Australian Bishops, Year 3, Year 5 and Year 9 students in Catholic schools across Western Australia will take part in *The Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment* (BRLA) from the week commencing Monday 6 August in Term Three. The assessment will be accessible to students only online.

Students enrolled in Year 3, Year 5 and Year 9 who are following a regular classroom program are expected to participate. Students with disability are also entitled to participate in the assessment. Exemptions may apply.

The Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment is a large-scale, standardised assessment that consists of a series of Religious Education (RE) tests. The purpose of the BRLA is to measure student learning of the content in the RE curriculum. The test items in the BRLA are developed and marked by the Office of Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA).

SAIN T MARY OF THE CROSS MCKILLOP WEDNESDAY 8TH AUGUST

Mary MacKillop is Australia's first saint. Mary was born in Victoria in the 1800s and devoted her life to teaching children. She believed everyone, no matter how rich or poor should have the chance to learn. Along with Fr Julian Tennison Woods, Mary MacKillop set up many schools. She also founded an order of nuns called the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, who continue to do the good work of Mary. Mary died on August 8th 1909 – her feast day. She was canonised a saint on 17th October 2010. The Liturgy Council will be leading the Prayer Assembly in honour of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop at 8.45am, in the Hall, on Wednesday 8th August. All are welcome to attend.

FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION WEDNESDAY 15TH AUGUST

This is a Holy Day of Obligation. There will be a **whole school mass** for all the children (PP-6) at **St Mary's Church** beginning at **9.30am**. All parents are welcome.

Mary was a very special person in every sense of the word. She was the Mother of Jesus and as such was born without original sin. As a fitting reward for the life she dedicated so wonderfully to God, she was taken up to Heaven, body and soul, when the course of her life on earth was finished.

CONTEMPORARY LEARNING IN YEAR 3, 4 AND 5

This year there has been a major focus in Years 3-5 on Contemporary Learning and making changes to suit the learning needs of our students. The contemporary learning approach is personalised, responding to the learning needs, interests and experiences of each student. *Contemporary learning aims to empower students with the knowledge, skills and capacities to respond creatively to the challenges of their world.* The classrooms are promoting communication, collaboration, critical thinking and creativity. This is all driven by the curriculum. It is important to note that explicit teaching and traditional learning also has a place in our contemporary vision at Aranmore CPS. This way of education integrates technology, engages students in different learning options, creates new learning and teaching possibilities and extends interactions with local and global communities.

The Year 3-5 teachers are teaching the curriculum through different learning experiences and have redesigned their classrooms to allow for students to find a work area that suits them. There are quiet areas for students to work independently, areas to collaborate and a place to come together for whole class learning. Furniture has been purchased to aid this type of learning and a few more changes will be slowly introduced. Rules have been established and the students have been taught how to learn in their new environments so maximum learning can be achieved.
