An incoming letter from CEWA:	
Dear Principals, Parents and Friends	
We are grateful for the work of the Parents and Friends Groups (P&Fs) which play	
an important role in supporting our Principals, school leaders, and teachers to	
partner with parents and caregivers as the first educators of their children. They	
also serve a vital function of providing local and contextual support for schools as	
we work together to build strong, positive Catholic school communities. Since	
CEWA's incorporation in 2020, we have been reviewing and improving our	
governance structures.	
Over the last year representatives from Catholic School Parents Western	
Australia (CSPWA), P&F Associations, the Catholic Primary Principals' Association,	
the Catholic Secondary Principals' Association and the Catholic Education Office	
have considered how to best structure and support the incredible work	
undertaken by P&Fs in our schools. On 2 September 2022, the Catholic Education	
Commission of Western Australia approved a single model of operation for P&Fs	
in CEWA schools. This will see the P&F operate as a committee of the Catholic	
school, governed by consistent Terms of Reference.	
Furthermore, it has been agreed that all unincorporated P&Fs within CEWA	
schools should operate under these Terms of Reference from January 2023. The	
Terms of Reference are distributed and will be put to motion at a special meeting	
next week.
