- hair that is longer than the collar is tied back, and hair is clipped or pulled away from the face.

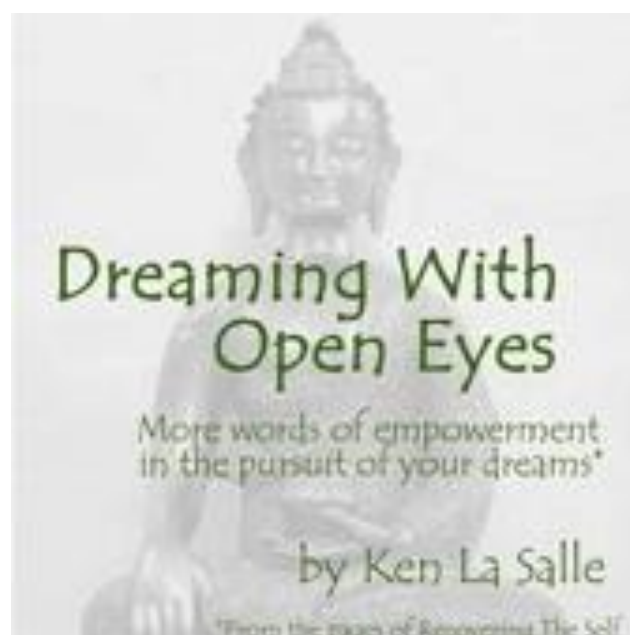
The school will support families who require assistance providing their child with the correct uniform. Please contact the office ought you require assistance.

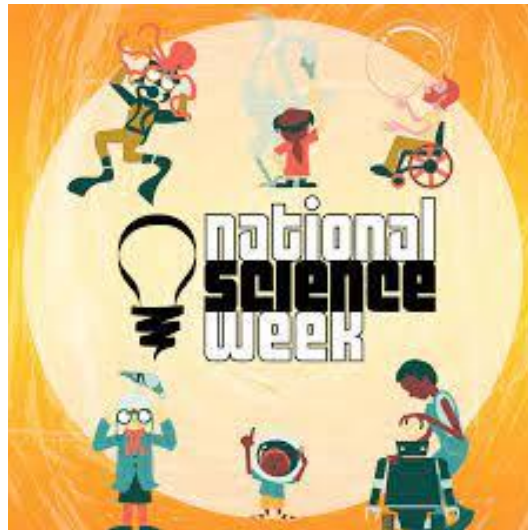


## Book Week Parade Day Change
