School Uniform

Our school uniform has always been integral to the sense of belonging to our Aranmore family. Students wear their uniform with great pride and are easily recognised in the community. All students are required to wear our school uniform. Recently there have been some deviations from our school uniform expectations. The expectations are:

- students' haircuts are conservative and not coloured
- black school shoes are school shoes, not black runners
- hair that is longer than the collar is tied back, and hair is clipped or pulled away from the face.

Bathroom and Toilet Facilities

In the best interests of looking after children safely, the following child protection matter is in place:

- Bathroom and toilet facilities are available for all visitors to the school in the administration area.
- All adults, siblings and visitors <u>must</u> use the facilities available in the administration area. Parents are not able to accompany their child to student toilets.

COVID-19 Updated Protocal

In term 4, COVID Isolation requirements have been removed and new baseline settings have been adopted:

If a student test positive to COVID-19:the student should remain home until symptoms resolve.

Register RAT results via WA Health and the COVID-19 Self-Reporting Portal.

Close contacts - A close contact is defined as a person from within the same household or a person who has had household-like contact with a COVID-19 positive person, during that person's infectious period.

Isolation of close contacts is no longer mandated but close contacts are encouraged to test daily for 5 days and only attend school following a negative RAT result.

Close contacts may choose to wear a mask.

Masks - Staff, students and visitors to a school may choose to wear a mask.
