
At Aranmore Catholic Primary School, we acknowledge that families are the most powerful influence on children's lives and that learning outcomes are most likely to be achieved when educators work in partnership with families. The rich and diverse communities of which the children are a part are valued and understood as central to their lives and learning. We respect the history, culture, language and traditions of families and communities and see learning in a social context built on collaboration and community participation.

Children in the early years learn most effectively through play-based experiences. It is through these experiences that children make sense of their world, as they engage with others and the environment. Our Pre-Primary program consists of learning experiences based on the needs, interests and abilities of the children. They incorporate a balance of intentional teaching and play-based learning, that provide children with opportunities to explore, discover, imagine and engage in purposeful and meaningful experiences.



BELONGING, BEING and BECOMING

At Aranmore Catholic Primary School, we provide a balanced curriculum, incorporating play-based learning and intentional teaching to address the requirements of the Australian Curriculum, Early Years Learning Framework and the State Curriculum and Standards Authority. A sense of belonging enables our early years students to engage in learning experiences and foster the development of warm and trusting relationships with the children in our care and their families.



Our priority is to provide the highest possible degree of childhood education. In striving to achieve this, the school is working towards attaining set qualities as set out by the new National Quality Standard. These areas have been identified by research as being the most important to ensure that the safety, health, well-being and educational and developmental outcomes of children can be met.

PRE-PRIMARY CURRICULUM

Our balanced Teaching and Learning programs encompass the Western Australian Curriculum and national Early Years Learning Framework: Being, Belonging and Becoming. Our early childhood teachers incorporate these outcomes and guidelines into the teaching and learning indoor and outdoor experiences to achieve a successful balance between educationally play-based and structured learning for the children.

The Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) communicates these expectations through the following five Learning Outcomes:

- · Children have a strong sense of identity
- Children are confident and involved learners
- Children are connected with and contribute to their world
- · Children have a strong sense of well-being
- Children are effective communicators

Religious Education

Catholic Schools are empowering today's students to make a positive impact in our everchanging world. In the early years, we nurture religious awareness through the children's learning experiences each day. Children are encouraged to wonder about God while nurturing a real and personal relationship. We teach the children about Jesus through prayers, songs, dance, drama and stories. A variety of topics are covered including All About Me, Family, Communities, Christmas, Easter, Church and Baptism.

Liturgies

Pre-Primary students take part in all whole school liturgical celebrations including Masses at St Mary's Church, Leederville, the celebration of Feast Days, Lent/Easter and Advent/Christmas.

The children participate in Whole School Liturgical Singing. The Pre-Primary classes celebrate a Liturgy of the Word lead by the Parish Priest. All parents and relatives are most welcome to join us for these events, which are indicated on the school calendar.

Assemblies

Whole school Assemblies take place on a Friday, commencing at 8:50am in the School Hall. All dates are indicated on our school calendar, which is accessible via the ACPS app and website. If your child is receiving a Merit Award, you will be notified by your class teacher through the Seesaw app.

Library

The Pre-Primary students will have an allocated time to visit the school library and borrow books. Please help your child to remember to bring their library bag on their designated day and return their borrowed book each week.

Attendance

Pre-Primary is the first official year of schooling in Western Australia and is compulsory for all children who turn five before 30 June. Should your child be unable to attend school, please ensure the school is notified as soon as possible. This can be completed on the Aranmore Catholic Primary School App (see page 16) or a phone call to the office.

Please notify the school in writing when your child returns after a period of absence, stating the date and reason of absence.

All children who arrive after the commencement of school 8.40am or if they are required to leave before 3.00pm, must be signed in/out at the front office, as per the school's procedure.

Drop off and pick up arrangements

- Parents are asked to wait with their children in the undercover area until the gate opens at 8.30am
- Children playing on the Early Learning Centre equipment before or after school must be supervised by parents/carers
- When the 8.30am bell sounds, the Early Learning Centre gates and classroom doors will be opened
- Upon entering the classroom, feel free to complete an activity with your child to help them get settled until the bell sounds at 8.40am
- Please be punctual when picking up your child if someone other than yourself is collecting your child, please inform the teacher
- Students who are collected at Kiss and Ride will be walked to and supervised by staff
 at the Kiss and Ride collection area located at the front of the school. Please let
 teacher know if your child is being collected at Kiss and Ride.

What to bring to Pre-Primary

- School bag
- Library bag
- Homework folder
- Aranmore hat
- Water bottle
- Lunch box containing crunch and sip snack, recess and lunch. Please send only the
 amount of food that your child can normally manage as he/she will be expected to
 make a reasonable effort to eat it.
 - In adherence to the school healthy eating policy please avoid packing lollies, unhealthy processed foods and foods high in sugar.
 - Lunch (not recess) can be ordered from the school canteen on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday
- A spare change of clothes "just in case"

Please ensure that hats, shoes, socks, uniforms, lunch/morning tea containers (including lids), water bottles and bags are clearly labelled.

Personal items

Please avoid bringing personal toys or items to school, as far as is possible, since any loss or accidental damage can be very distressing. If your child brings a toy or object to school as part of their news telling, this will be kept safe by the class teacher until news time and returned at the end of the school day.

What to wear in Pre-Primary

Our uniform is a sign of our community and belonging to Aranmore Catholic Primary School (ACPS). Pre-Primary children wear the sports uniform all year around and are expected to be attired in correct and complete school uniform at all times. Hats are part of the uniform and need to be worn every day.

(Term 2 and Term 3)

White ACPS socks
ACPS hat

Hair

- Hair, for both health reasons and appearance, is to be neat and tidy
- Shoulder length hair is to be tied back (with red, white or blue hair ties or clips)
- Hair styles should be of a conservative nature (no tracks, etc)
- Hair should be no shorter than number 2 cut

The Leadership Team shall have discretion in determining appropriate hairstyles

Jewellery

For safety and security reasons, it is <u>recommended</u> that no jewellery be worn to school. Children are permitted to wear:

- A watch (no smart watches)
- A bracelet
- A maximum of one earring in each ear, must be worn in the lobe (sleepers or discrete studs only)
- A necklace with a small Christian religious medallion or cross

The school accepts no responsibility for loss or damage of jewellery.

If you are unsure of uniform requirements, please speak to your classroom teacher.



HEALTH and WELL-BEING

The health and well-being of your child is of upmost importance to us - please keep staff informed should there be anything that could affect his/her participation at school.

Medical

If your child is unwell, please do not send him/her to school. Illnesses such as gastroenteritis, conjunctivitis, coughs and colds are highly contagious and can spread rapidly through a group of young children.

If your child has a common communicable infection such as chicken pox, measles, diarrhea or hand, foot and mouth disease – please contact the school so that other families can be notified due to the risk of further infection.

We closely follow protocols set by the Health Department for the management of COVID-19 and will keep you informed of any action required. Anti-bacterial hand gel is available in all classrooms.

Medication

If your child requires medication, this must be administered before/after school where possible.

If your child requires medication whilst at school:

- we ask that you come to school to administer the daytime dosage.
- staff can administer medications if required; however, medical consent forms must be completed by parents prior to this occurring.

It is imperative the school is notified of any allergies or medical concerns so that a Medical Action Plan for your child can be put in place if required. If your child has a severe allergy or asthma plan, a copy of this plan must be provided to the school office, together with Ventolin, spacers and epi-pens.

Aranmore Catholic Primary School is an allergy aware school as some of our students have allergies to nuts, eggs, etc. The school will make you aware of which food items you can and cannot pack into school lunch boxes.

Birthdays

Birthdays are a special time in the lives of young children and we are happy to celebrate your child's special day. Please keep healthy eating in mind if you provide birthday treats. Lollipops on sticks are not suitable for safety reasons.

Children with allergies are asked to supply some small items at the beginning of each year, so they are not left out if they are unable to eat the birthday treat provided (these will be kept in a staff drawer or freezer). Please note that birthday party invitations are not to be given out at school to avoid disappointment for those who do not receive one.

PARENT PARTNERSHIPS

Communication

The quality of the learning experience we offer is enhanced by the development of strong and supportive community relationships, which we work hard to grow and strengthen between students, families and staff.

Please keep the staff informed of matters concerning your child's health, well-being and changes at home that could affect his/her participation. If we reciprocate in keeping communications open and up to date, then we can ensure Pre-Primary is a positive experience for your child.

There are opportunities for an informal chat with the classroom teacher before and after the Pre-Primary session. If you have any concerns or questions regarding your child and would like to have a more in-depth conversation, please make an appointment directly with the class teacher or via email to admin@aranmorecps.wa.edu.au .

Guiding Children's Behaviours

In Pre-Primary we encourage students to think about and make good choices. We model and encourage students to solve problems. Parents will be notified regarding concerns or repetitive inappropriate behaviours.

Parent Helpers

We love to have parents assist with learning experiences and excursions in Pre-Primary. The classroom teacher will provide a roster for parents to indicate their interest and availability to be involved. Unfortunately, we are unable to invite siblings into the classroom during this time.

Grandparents play an important role in the lives of young children and we welcome grandparents on roster; however, a Working With Children check is required by all helpers, aside from parents. The Working With Children card will need to be presented to the front office. Please refer to www.workingwithchildren.wa.gov.au for further information.

All helpers (parents and grandparents) are required to sign the School's Code of Conduct. It is important to stress that parent helpers are not permitted to discuss with others the behaviour or performance of any of the students. In this way we safeguard the feelings of others and maintain high levels of professionalism and confidentiality.

The Catholic School Parents of WA (CSPWA) formally Parents and Friends Association is a magnificent friend-raising and fund-raising group within our school who organise social events for the parents and children and also assist in purchasing additional resources for our school.
