#### Why Ash Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, occurring six and a half weeks before Easter. Ashes have a strong symbolic meaning in our Christian Church and serve as a reminder of our human mortality.

#### What is Lent? For All Future Generations

Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and palms giving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Scripture; we serve by giving palms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptised into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

This is our first of our fortnightly newsletters for 2024 and we are back to regular programming next week. Regular timetable and activities for all. Next week is also the beginning of the Church's LENTEN season, beginning Ash Wednesday. The Years four, five and six students will walk to and from school to attend 9:00am mass at St Mary's. The younger children will receive 'ashes' from a member of the leadership team upon our return.

**School communication process** has once again been updated to reflect the 38 hour work week for teachers and their **right to disconnect.** Please note that our school procedure has always been <u>48 hours to</u> return an email and ten business days to investigate a complaint. This has not changed. The updated procedure accompanies this newsletter and is on the school website.

An **unexpected**, **unforeseen change to the curriculum** needs to take place. Until further advised, curriculum Music will be replaced by curriculum **DANCE**, taught by Miss Oregioni. This will <u>not</u> influence private instrument or vocal lessons, <u>these will continue</u>. The school will meet the requirements of the curriculum authority and the children will be assessed in DANCE, similarly to music. A **final performance** will take place, with parents and carers invited, just as done in the past with Edu Dance and Make a Move Dance programs.

This week we welcomed our **Chinese** cultural exchange students. It has been wonderful to see the children integrating with our children, joining in all learning activities, and getting a taste of school life in Australia. Some of our students are here until the end of next week, and some are here for another week. Thank you to all for helping to make the students feel welcome and being a part of our great community.

**Swimming lessons** were welcome relief for students these past two weeks! While some of us enjoy the heat, some do not. Did you know that when the temperature is above 36 degrees, students do not go outside for recess or lunch, rather they have lunch in rooms, supervised by teachers and enjoy each other's company, play board games or if fortunate, watch a cartoon or two.
