#### Week 4

Earlier this week the Church celebrated the special feast days of All Saints and All Souls. On these days, we remember and pray for all those who have died, especially for 'saints' in heaven. Many families would have celebrated Halloween during this time.

Halloween is a 'direct derivation of All Saints Day' with 'All Hallows' in Old English meaning 'the feast of the saints.' To hallow is 'to make holy or sacred, to sanctify or consecrate, to venerate.' The adjective hallowed, as used in The Lord's Prayer, means holy, consecrated, sacred, or revered. The noun hallow, as used in Hallowtide, is a synonym of the word saint. There are some differences between Halloween, All Saints Day and All Souls Day, however they are tied together. It is important to keep in mind that All Saints Day is also known as All Hallows Day, Hallowmas or Feast of All Saints in the Christian Church. The day November 1 commemorates all the saints in the church both known and unknown who have attained heaven.

Shortly teachers will be allocating children into **classes** for **2021**. Class placements are a team decision made in consultation with classroom teachers and the Leadership team.

Teachers spend a lot of time and give great consideration to the placement of children. Consideration for placement is made using the following criteria:

- Academic ability
- Sociograms / Friendships- each child is given the opportunity to list six students they might like to have in their class. Teachers consider these sorts for class placements and ensure the child has at least one of their nominated persons in the class.
- Gender balance
- Pastoral and Emotional Wellbeing
- Special Needs e.g. learning difficulties
- Behaviour

Every effort is made to place children where it is felt they will have the greatest opportunity to succeed. If you feel there are extenuating circumstances which may need consideration in the placement of your child, please email these to me via <a href="mailto:admin@aranmorecps.wa.edu.au">admin@aranmorecps.wa.edu.au</a> no later than Monday 16 November for consideration. Requests for particular placement are not guaranteed. Requesting a certain teacher is not a consideration. You will receive your child's class placement via email on Monday of week 10.

## CONGRATULATIONS

This year Filip and I (Jarvin) participated in NATA's Young Scientist of the Year (2020) competition and we placed third in the 9-10 age group. This competition was based on the question; Why is food testing important and why does it protect the safety of Australians. Jennifer Evans, the chief executive of NATA, hosted this across all of Australia. In September, over 200 people sent in their answers as to why food testing is important. Our experiment focused on how to best remove germs from a surface using UV powder and a UV light and how to remove it best using different products. Our results were a sponge and water worked best with only 0.2 % of the UV powder remaining because it absorbed the germs. I would like to give a really big special thanks to Miss Wilson for Submitting it to NATA and to Mrs Chang-Leng for teaching Science in the best way possible.
