JUST A REMINDER!

Before the 8:45am rings, families are asked to move out of the classroom quickly as teachers need to commence their lessons on time. We ask that parents do not hold conversations close to the classroom door as the chatter can be disruptive to classroom teaching, particularly at the start of the day when we commence with prayer. We welcome parents on the school site but ask that you please be respectful of the school as a learning space. Perhaps take advantage of the many coffee shops and cafes we have on our doorstep for catching up with one another.

Once school has been dismissed. Children are to make their way to cars quickly so that parents can alleviate traffic congestion and make room for others who are yet to arrive for pick up. If you choose to stay back after school for a play on the adventure playground, we ask parents to please supervise your children closely.
