Dear Parents

This coming weekend, St Mary's Parish celebrates **First Holy Communion**. I would like to wish all the Year Four children the very best as they receive Jesus for the very first time through this special sacrament. Thank you to our Year Four Teachers, Mrs Raschilla and Mrs Meade for preparing the children so beautifully and to Assistant Principals Sarah Lister and Tania James, for working closely with the parish Religious Education coordinator and Father Angelo, to ensure that the sacramental celebrations run smoothly.

We will celebrate **Mercy Day** on the 21st September. It is a day when we reflect upon the Sisters of Mercy and their involvement with our school. Aranmore (then St Mary's) was founded in 1903 by the Sisters of Mercy. Since its beginnings, the school has been under the principalship of the Mercy order of religious however 1999 saw the retirement of its religious head allowing for the first lay principal to carry on the Mercy tradition. We will be having Mercy Day celebrations at our school in honour of our school heritage commencing with a whole school mass in the hall and fun activities for the children to enjoy in their factions during the day.

On Tuesday 18 September from 3.15pm-6.30pm we have a **Learning Journey** at school for Kindy-Year 6. Parents will have the opportunity to come to school and visit their child's/children's classrooms to view the work the children have achieved thus far in the year. It is a wonderful way for your child to be able to showcase to you, their parents, all the hard work and effort that they have been diligently displaying this term. It is also an opportunity to discuss with your child areas of possible improvement. Teachers will be in attendance, however, should you wish to discuss your child's progress in detail, an appointment should be made for a more convenient time.

The Year 1-3 students are thoroughly enjoying the Loose Parts Play at our school. **Loose Parts Play** was the brainchild Simon Nicholson back in the 1970s, who believed that it is the loose parts in our environment that empower our creativity. As Meerlinga explains: "*Using loose parts adds depth and richness to play. Children need to be able to use real resources in their play, not just toys. Playing with a variety of loose parts assists with these approaches.*" Source: <u>https://www.meerilinga.org.au/news/play-based-learning-using-loose-parts/</u>

Why Loose Parts?

There are many reasons why play spaces include a multitude of loose parts, including:

- Loose parts can be used anyway children choose
- Loose parts can be adapted and manipulated in many ways
- Loose parts encourage creativity and imagination
- Loose parts develop more skill and competence than most modern plastic toys
- Loose parts can be used in many different ways
- Loose parts can be used in combination with other materials to support imagination
- Loose parts encourage open ended learning
- Children choose loose parts over fancy toys

Loose parts create endless possibilities and invite creativity. For example, if a child picks up a shell and starts to play, most likely that shell can become anything the child wants it to be. Imagination, creativity, curiosity, desire and need are the motivation of loose parts. Loose parts are materials that can be moved, carried, combined, redesigned, lined up, taken apart, and put back together in multiple ways. Loose parts can be used alone or combined with other materials. There is no set of specific directions for materials that are considered loose parts.

We are putting out **a call to all parents for materials** to not only top up our Junior Primary Loose Parts Play box but we also want to start a <u>Yr 4-6 Loose Parts Play</u> box next term. Please bring in any of the following or other suitable materials and pop them in the Yr 1-3 box in the undercover area or in the Yr 4-6 box, which will be located outside at the back of the hall next term. Please clean out your cupboards, garages, and sheds on the holidays!

Loose parts can be natural or synthetic materials. Below are some examples but there can be so much more:

Pipes Funnels Foam Wooden boards Ropes Straws Tubes

Lids Pop sticks Plastic pipes Shells Cardboard String

Cups

Baskets Crates boxes Balls Cylinders Masking tape

Spoons Plastic plates/cups Fabric Buckets Spools Caps
