**Loose Parts Play** was the brainchild Simon Nicholson back in the 1970s, who believed that it is the loose parts in our environment that empower our creativity. As Meerlinga explains: "Using loose parts adds depth and richness to play. Children need to be able to use real resources in their play, not just toys. Playing with a variety of loose parts assists with these approaches." ### Why Loose Parts?

There are many reasons why play spaces include a multitude of loose parts, including:

- Loose parts can be used anyway children choose
- Loose parts can be adapted and manipulated in many ways
- Loose parts encourage creativity and imagination
- Loose parts develop more skill and competence than most modern plastic toys
- Loose parts can be used in many different ways
- Loose parts can be used in combination with other materials to support imagination
- Loose parts encourage open ended learning
- Children choose loose parts over fancy toys

Loose parts create endless possibilities and invite creativity. For example, if a child picks up a shell and starts to play, that shell can become anything the child wants it to be. Imagination, creativity and curiosity are the motivation of loose parts. Loose parts are materials that can be moved, carried, combined, redesigned, lined up, taken apart and put back together in multiple ways. Loose parts can be used alone or combined with other materials. There is no set of specific directions for materials that are considered loose parts.

At Aranmore Catholic Primary School, we wish to foster the Loose Parts Play theory by integrating some loose parts into our recess and lunchtime play for our juniors. We will have a special storage section for the loose parts, which the children can access. The independent play is fostered by the children bringing out the items they need for their play session, then packing them away at the end.

Loose parts can be natural or synthetic materials. Below are some examples but there can be so much more:

- pipes
- spoons
- plastic plates/cups
- fabric
- wooden boards
- plastic pipes
- balls
- buckets
- cups
- funnels
- lids
- foam
- pop sticks

- baskets
- crates
- boxes
- rope
- shells
- cylinders
- spools
- straws
- cardboard
- masking tape
- caps
- tubes
- string

I was absolutely delighted when we had the verge collection in our suburb a few weeks ago and was out busily scouring the streets for all sorts of loose parts materials. I found a treasure trove of goodies that will start our collection off however I am asking for your assistance. If you are able to contribute to the Loose Parts equipment box, please feel free to drop off items between 8:15am-8:45am and 2:30-3:15pm during the week.

The box will be left unlocked for you to drop off your materials. We will have the box inside the undercover area to start with and children can take materials anywhere to play, the undercover area, adventure playground etc. Once we have enough the drop off box will remain locked and we will open for the children at lunchtimes. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.
