## CURRICULUM

### STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

Aranmore Catholic Primary School uses a variety of ways to communicate student achievement. Some of these include formal reports, Learning Journeys and Parent Teacher Interviews. Remember that your child's growth is not just measured against academic achievement but also pastoral, spiritual and social development. Please remember that a 'C' grade indicates your child has put in a great deal of effort to reach the necessary benchmarks expected of them for that year level. This should be celebrated! 'C' grades are not an indication of poor achievement. If you have concerns or queries about your child's growth and development, please be sure to make an appointment with the class teacher.

*“Some students will have progressed beyond the achievement standard; others will need additional support. The expected standard for each year is described as 'C'. Many students will be given the same grade in semester 1 and semester 2, even though their teachers will have observed growth in learning. Bearing in mind that work in Semester 2 builds on Semester 1, maintaining a grade indicates students have held their own in the face of more advanced material and in this way have grown in their learning.”*

# SUMMARY OF SCHOOL SAFETY

## SUPERVISION TIMES

The school provides supervision before and after school to keep our children safe.

- Before school supervision commences at 8:15am
- After school supervision ceases at 3:20pm

**Please ensure your children are not onsite prior to 8:15am.** If you must be at school before 8:15am you must remain with your child until 8:15am when a teacher commences duty. Front reception is not responsible for the supervision of students. Alternatively, you can access Gum Trees Before and After School facilities (Ph: 0427 471 201 Email: gumtree.oshc@ymca.org.au). **Please note, that school grounds are closed at 3:20pm.**

This means gates are locked and access to the school, including toilets, are not available after this time. Please be aware of this if you choose to stay and play on the Adventure Playground.

## VISTING OUR SCHOOL

The school operates between 8:15am and 3:20pm. Any persons, including parent, grandparents and other members of the community, who are visiting the school between 9:00am-2:30pm **must report to reception first**, before proceeding onto school grounds. This includes any parents dropping off lunches, books, etc. It is for the safety of our school community that all visitors are noted on arrival. Please do not proceed on to school grounds without first signing in at reception. This even includes if you plan to "pop in" to drop off something to your child. Please help us keep our school safe by following protocol.

## CODE OF CONDUCT

All Catholic Schools have a Code of Conduct. This is the minimum standard for how all persons are expected to behave in our school to ensure the safety and well-being of students, staff, parents and other community members. There are 12 statements associated with the Code and these are expanded on in the policy section of our school website.

1. You act safely and competently.
2. You give priority to students' safety and well-being in all your behaviour and decision making.
3. You act in accordance with the values of the Gospel as defined in the Code of Ethical Conduct.
4. You conduct yourself in accordance with laws, agreements, policies and standards relevant to your relationship with the school community.
5. You respect the dignity, culture, values and beliefs of each member of the school community.
6. You treat personal information about members of the school community as private and confidential.
7. You give impartial, honest and accurate information about the education, safety and well-being of students.

8. You support all members of the school community in making informed decisions about students.
9. You promote and preserve the trust and privilege inherent in your relationship with all members of the school community.
10. You maintain and build on the community's trust and confidence in Catholic schools and the Church.
11. You act reflectively and ethically.
12. You allow students to have a voice in their education, safety and well-being.

## PETS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

A reminder to all families and friends that all pets, including dogs, are not permitted on school grounds unless authorised by the Principal. Whilst most dogs are family pets and may not react badly to child interaction, in a school setting their behaviour may be excitable and unpredictable. Some students may also react to dogs in an unpredictable way which could cause the dog or the child harm. Some children also have allergies to animals.

If you see someone with their dog on school grounds, please feel free to remind them of this guideline as it is in place to ensure the safety of our children. If your pet, including your dog, really must accompany you at school drop off/pick up time, please wait for your child outside the school grounds, away from the main thoroughfares, to minimise contact with other students.

## MORNING DROP OFF – STAFF CAR PARK

Please do not use the staff carparks as a kiss and drive area in the mornings. Whilst we appreciate wet weather conditions can prompt some parents to do this, **it is imperative for the safety of our students, that the carparks are not used in this manner.** Vehicles are constantly moving in and out of carparks throughout the mornings and afternoons due to staff arriving at different times and attending offsite meetings. There is danger in having children in the carpark while cars are reversing, parking, leaving site, etc.

Both Staff car parks should only be for staff parking and no parent/guardians should be using these for parking or a drop off/pickup point.

## PRE-PRIMARY & KINDERGARTEN PLAYGROUND

Please note, for the safety of students, no children (including younger siblings) are permitted on the Early Learning Centre play equipment **before school or after school.** **This is a safety requirement.** Even if parents are present to supervise, please note play is not permitted. Most Catholic schools abide by this same rule for safety reasons. **We ask parents to please cooperate with the School and the Early Childhood Staff and please remind your children not to play on the equipment before and after school.**
