Yesterday Year 1 Red presented the **Grandparents Liturgy** and had a fun time playing games with grandparents and special family members. Thank you to everyone for participating and making this a lovely morning.

**Swimming lessons** for the junior students (PP - 2) begin next week. We look forward to seeing the students have a lot of fun, as they improve their skills. Parents, please refer to the messages you have received via Seesaw for all the details.

Merit Awards process for Term 4, students will receive a Merit Award in Term 4. Merit Awards will be presented to students and acknowledged by the school after lunch on Fridays. Class teachers will take a photo of each student with their certificate and send via Seesaw to parents.

Shortly teachers will be allocating children into classes for 2021. Class placements are a team decision made in consultation with classroom teachers and the Leadership team. Teachers spend a lot of time and give great consideration to the placement of children. Consideration for placement is made using the following criteria:

- Academic ability
- Sociograms / Friendships- each child is given the opportunity to list six students they might like to have in their class. Teachers consider these sorts for class placements and ensure the child has at least one of their nominated persons in the class.
- Gender balance
- Pastoral and emotional wellbeing
- Special needs e.g. learning difficulties
- Behaviour

Every effort is made to place children where it is felt they will have the greatest opportunity to succeed. If you feel there are extenuating circumstances which may need consideration in the placement of your child, please email these to me via <a href="mailto:admin@aranmorecps.wa.edu.au">admin@aranmorecps.wa.edu.au</a> no later than Monday 16 November for consideration. You will receive your child's class placement via email on Monday of week 10.

**Kiss N Ride** continues to cause safety issues. Parents are asked to drive slowly through Brentham Street, especially during drop-off and pick up. A reminder that banking on the curb is dangerous to our students, parents and neighbours. We are working with the City of Vincent to improve the safety for all.

Assemblies, Prayer Assemblies and Community Participation. For the duration of the term, all parents and family members of the class presenting the assembly/liturgy/mass are invited to attend the celebration. We ask that ALL visitors come to the office to sign in & out (as per COVID requirement), before and after the celebration. This way visitors are accounted for in the event of the need to contact those on site, at that particular time. Social distancing is in play. Parents are asked to use the sliding doors from the north side of the hall.

Assemblies will continue to be recorded to share live with the student community, and to share via Seesaw with the relevant families who are unable to attend. Masses and Liturgies of the Word will not be recorded in respect of the reverence of the sacrament/liturgy.
